Storytimes & Crafts

This year has seen some exciting and innovative programming for children, tweens and teens, throughout the entire Torrance Public Library System. The Youth Services Department continues to provide multiple weekly storytimes at each location that continues to instill early literacy skills and special bonding time with children and their caregivers. Additionally, all library locations continue to host numerous craft programs that allow participants to express themselves creatively, all of which would not be possible without the generosity of the Friends of the Torrance Public Library.

Summer Reading Program

This year during the Torrance Public Library's "It's Showtime at your Library" Summer Reading Program, Henderson Library hosted performance programs ranging from marionettes to balloon making to amazing jugglers. These stellar programs welcomed nearly 800 people to the branch in just ten short weeks! North Torrance Library introduced new programs that were educating and entertaining, for example, the "Puppy Power Hour", in collaboration with BARK allowed children an opportunity to practice their reading skills out loud to therapy dogs while their owners sat patiently by. While attendees were awaiting their turn, library staff provided a variety of dog-themed crafts to create and even dog-themed books to choose from.

Science Tellers

Also at North Torrance Library, the Youth Librarian hosted ScienceTellers, a program that utilizes science experiments in storytelling that engages and educates audience members, as part of our annual Science Month programming. Audience members are selected to re-create science experiments and learn what causes certain reactions and effects, which proved to

be incredibly informative and stimulating and generated further interest in science experiments as many participants wished to check out science related books following the program. All programs for January's Science Month are funded by the Friends of the Torrance Public Library and always prove to be informative and delightful.

PORTAL

Utilizing the Library's PORTAL (Portable Online Resource and Technology Access Lab) laptops, numerous locations

have been hosting Coding Programs in efforts to give students and participants the tools to develop computer programming skills and enhance computer science knowledge.



In addition, locations having been combining PORTAL

coding programs with Spheros, which are mobile robots that are controlled via coding, that give participants an opportunity to glean computer science knowledge while utilizing robotics and coding together. One Sphero program hosted by the Southeast Library incorporated painting with the robots, which allowed for the unique combination of computer science, robotics, and art all in one program! The Civic Center Library has had the fortune opportunity to expand its programming thanks to the donations of the Friends of the Torrance Public Library. Civic Center Library has been hosting regular monthly Coding programs utilizing PORTAL. WALTERIA Library's most exciting program of the year was "All Kids Can Code Robots". Using the PORTAL and Sphero robots, participants coded the robots through a four-hole min-golf course set up in the library. There were many happy gasps as the Spheros found their way into the "cup", sometimes up to 20 feet away and around obstacles. Not only were the participants given an opportunity to play with new innovative technology, but also learn and enhance their computer programming skills.

Lastly, this year the Torrance Public Library has been lucky enough to receive multiple

grants from the California State Library.

Learning 2 Go

El Retiro Library received an \$8000 grant from the California State Library and created Learning 2 Go Kits, which are early literacy kits designed for

patrons to be able to take home to help develop and foster early literacy skills. The Learning 2 Go Kits focus on Art, Music, Sensory Experiences, Literacy, Gross Motor Skills, and Fine Motor Skills. The circulating kits include an easy to carry tote, books, manipulatives, and activities designed to encourage young children to learn as they play. With generous donations from the Friends of the Torrance Public Library, the kits will be able to be replenished as needed for years to come and further allows the Torrance Public Library to offer a dynamic resource that supports developmental learning goals and yet incorporates fun!

Music Lab

Southeast Library youth services received a \$10,000 grant from the California State Library and initiated The Music Lab, which allowed participants to get hands-on experience from a wide range of electronic music instruments, including keyboards, electronic drums, sound manipulators, and much more. In addition, with generous donations from the Friends of the Library, The Music Lab was also able to provide vinyl records for participants to listen to music, giving users a chance to listen to a variety of music genres and then attempt to recreate the sounds via the music instruments. The Music Lab proved to be not only popular but fulfilling as well. Many school curriculums have limited or eliminated Arts from students' studies, and the Music Lab has given students an opportunity to express themselves creatively, further cognitive thinking, and garner an appreciation of music.

All youth programs are funded by generous donations from the Friends of the Torrance Public Library and without their support, none of our exciting, educational, and entertaining programs would be possible.
