Remembering Helen Ball

Helen Ball, past President of the Friends of the Torrance Library and long-time volunteer, has passed away. Helen was a dynamic, driving force for the Friends – and until recently in the Library every single day, putting hours into the book sales, organizing the volunteers, and serving on the Board.

It was my pleasure to work with Helen for many years, and in many ways. At the City of Torrance volunteer recognition dinners, she would charge in and ensure that all her Friends had prime seats – both for recognition by the City Council, and for access to the buffet line. She got up before Council when they began formally accepting donations, always praising the work of the volunteers, and reminding all in attendance when the next book sale was happening!



She also jumped into new adventures with us. When I was working on the Frankenstein traveling exhibit, and lots of related programming, my colleague and I wanted a truly wonderful opening reception. The Friends had paid for public programs, and were already funding many for this exhibition period, but this was something new. They gave us the funds for an opening reception that included a presentation from the daughter of Boris Karloff, and a visit by Frankenstein's monster – carrying his library card. Helen also championed the funding of our Centennial Celebration in 2013, ongoing adult programs, and our ever growing list of magnificent things we now do as routine, and our community has come to expect.

Helen truly knew human nature, and I would be reminded of her background in social work when I saw her interact with people. She could be a boss's boss, and would tell you when she did not like an answer, but she also was not going to ask anyone to do anything she hadn't done herself, and often would do the job right beside you.

Helen was a dynamic volunteer leader, true champion of the Torrance Library, and a wonderful people person. She was also just supremely nice, supportive, and a leader by example. She will be sorely missed, and her wonderful legacy lives on in the Friends of the Torrance Library.

Some Other Things about Helen

At 75, Helen spent six months with her late husband's nephew sailing from Hawaii to Tahiti and back on a 38 foot ketch. Storms on the return trip kept them from reaching Honolulu for several weeks.

"I look back at it," she said "and think it was the most life-changing thing I've ever done. . . You learn that nature is so strong. You can't win; you have to go with it. I think of the power of the waves, of being out there with a little, tiny boat, just bobbing around."
